**Draft** Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting, held on Monday 14th May 2007 at 7.30pm in the Village Hall, St Peter's.

**3/07 Minutes of Last Parish Meeting:**

Due to an administrative error the minutes for the previous year were not available for signature.

**4/07 Annual Reports:** The Vice Chairman presented a brief annual report on behalf of the Parish Council. His verbal report covered the Warden Partnership Scheme with the City Council, explaining the arrangements and the work already carried out. He expressed appreciation for the voluntary work of Mr. D. Edgerton and Mrs. P. Bunney in respect of litter clearance and School Competitions etc. His report updated the four persons present on Dog Fouling Bin provision, the Worcester in Bloom, and associated St Peter's in Bloom, initiatives, problems of residents in respect of the Old Oil Depot development, safe crossings on St Peter's Drive, links with Tesco and Power Park. He expressed further appreciation in respect of Newslink and the team responsible for its production.

**5/07 Matters Arising, Public Open Forum.**

Serious concern was expressed regarding the number of Tesco trolleys left abandoned for long periods and sometimes overnight. The Chairman agreed that in due course the Councillor with responsibility for liaising with Tesco's would take this matter up with the Manager.

The Rev Martin Hodson gave an introductory report on the St Peter's Baptist Church, highlighting activities and the new coffee shop facility. This met with welcoming approval.

Cllr. R. Knight arrived at this point and gave an up to date account of the progress in respect of the proposed Community Centre, and the associated Multiple Use Games Area, to be purchased from the Old Oil Depot Section 106 Money.

There being no further items raised, the Chairman closed the meeting and thanked everyone for their attendance.
